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Executive Summary

The sixth and final phase of the MAPP Process is the Action Cycle. During this phase, a MAPP Steering Committee was formed, as well as an Action Team for each identified MAPP Strategic Issue. Strategic Issue Action Teams, guided by the Strategic Issue Champion, further refined goals, strategies, implementation activities, and timelines from the previous phase to create a finalized work plan for their strategic issue area. Together, the work plans for the strategic issues form the foundation for the 2015-2020 Livingston County Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP). The Action Cycle began with the final MAPP Team meeting held on November 12, 2015 and will continue until the end of 2020. Regular implementation progress reports for each strategic issue will be provided to the MAPP Steering Committee via Strategic Issue Champions. The Steering Committee will then disseminate Strategic Issue updates to the MAPP Team, key community stakeholders, and the general public as strategic issue activities begin to be implemented by the Action Teams.

The Process

The sixth and final stage of the MAPP process began with the November 12, 2015 MAPP Team meeting. To start The Action Cycle meeting, Dennis Dolan, Livingston County Board of Commissioners; Brynt Ellis, Executive Director of Livingston Operations for St Joseph Mercy Livingston and Brighton; and Dianne McCormick, Director / Health Officer for the Livingston County Department of Public Health, each gave welcoming remarks expressing their appreciation for the MAPP Team's commitment to improving the health and wellbeing of Livingston County. After the welcoming remarks, an overview of the MAPP process was provided, highlighting key accomplishments that have been achieved.

During The Action Cycle meeting, MAPP Team facilitators presented awards to all MAPP Team participants, recognizing their dedication to participating in the MAPP process. Additionally, MAPP participants with perfect or near perfect attendance at MAPP meetings were presented with "Outstanding Dedication" awards. After awards had been distributed, Strategic Issue Champions who were identified in the previous phase were acknowledge and thanked for their efforts to draft the initial work plans for their strategic issue.

MAPP Team members were then asked to consider volunteering to sit on the MAPP Steering Committee or a MAPP Strategic Issue Action Team, with the intention of keeping all MAPP participants engaged in the process even after the final meeting concluded. Prior to the meeting, all Strategic Issue Champions were asked to sit on the Steering Committee to represent their strategic issue area. Additionally, each strategic issue will have an Action Team, which will be tasked with assisting the Strategic Issue Champion in reviewing and adopting the strategic issue work plan, implementing strategic issue activities, and conducting evaluations. Together, the Steering Committee and the Action Teams will continue to work towards achieving the community vision set forth during the first MAPP Team meeting in November 2014.

An overview was then provided of how the results of the MAPP process, specifically the ten finalized strategic issue work plans, would form the foundation for the 2015-2020 Livingston County Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP). Next steps were discussed, including when the CHIP would be completed and how the CHIP would be distributed. Lastly, the MAPP Team was informed that they would continue to receive regular updates from the Steering Committee about implementation activities, progress, evaluations, and accomplishments related to each MAPP Strategic Issue. A final evaluation was distributed through SurveyMonkey to all MAPP participants to assess the efficiency and effectiveness of the entire MAPP process. The final MAPP Team meeting concluded with a MAPP Team picture commemorating the 2015 Livingston County MAPP Team.
